STREAM CLEAN-UP:

REZONING ISSUES:

The Planning Commission completed their round of rezoning issues pertaining to NAC5.

They approved the Cawley Property that is located next to the Firehouse on Baughman's Lane as R8. The Conley Farm was approved for R8 zoning but with a PND. The Mall property was approved to remain Mixed Use. Now the issues go to the Mayor and Board.

It is extremely important for our citizens to make an appearance at each and every meeting and workshop to discuss and voice opinions on these issues. We will be sending out information on each meeting; please, be sure to attend and speak.

CITY STREET PARKING:

Just a reminder that there are rules for parking on City Streets. You can not park in one place without moving your vehicle for more than 48 hours. Also, no oversized vehicles can park on City Streets. The size of the vehicle includes the racks, ladders, etc. You will be ticketed by the Police for oversized vehicles and can be towed.

CITY BUDGET HEARINGS:

Our City will be holding budget hearings every Wednesday in April. Have a voice in the budget and how it is applied. Come out to the meetings.

DRUG DISPOSAL EVENT:

The City is having another drug disposal event at Harry Grove Stadium on Saturday, April 27 from 10am to 2pm. They will be accepting over the counter drugs, prescription drugs, pet drugs and ointments.

City Police Activity:

I was very pleased when our Police reported that our area of the City is truly getting on Board with calling the police when they see anything out of the ordinary...way to go NAC 5.

If you see anything suspicious, call. Keep your cars locked with all items out of sight and keep your windows and doors locked on your home. Be sure to keep your area well lite at all times.

Frederick Police arrest two males for Cocaine Possession, driver also DUI. 13-012472

On today's date, 02-26-13, at approximately 2255 hours, OFC Aaron Gregware of the Frederick Police Department's Patrol Division initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle for erratic driving in the area of Waverly Drive and Key Parkway. When the driver was getting ready to perform Standard Field Sobriety Tests, he was observed throwing a baggy of cocaine to the ground. After he was arrested, the vehicle was searched and the passenger was also found to be in possession of cocaine. The driver, identified as Hermerson David Barahona, was also found to have over two times the legal level of blood alcohol content. His brother, Deras Hector Barahona, was charged with possession of cocaine. Both were processed and were taken to Central Booking.

Frederick Police arrest 5 subejcts for possession of synthetic cannabinoid (spice) NAC 8 13-013268

On 03-01-13, at approximately 11:00pm OFC K Donovan and Off S Radtke, of the Frederick Police Department Patrol Division, were working a plain clothes assignment in the area of W Patrick St and McCain Dr. While in a local business the officers overheard 4 males discussing smoking narcotics. A short time later another male, identified as David Christopher Harmon, met the other 4 in the business and the 5 walked outside. OFC Donovan and Off Radtke maintained observation and requested marked patrol units respond. As the 5 were smoking a substance, later to be found synthetic cannabinoid (SPICE), they were taken into custody without incident. Harmon was found to be an adult and the other 4 juveniles. Harmon was issued a criminal citation and released from the station. The juveniles were charged through DJS.

The charging documents served on Naylor and Monroe are from an on-going criminal investigation into the passing of counterfeit \$100 bills at a local business to make transactions. The investigation conducted by Det. Holler revealed that Naylor and Monroe had used the \$100 bills to make purchases at a local business.

Naylor and Monroe are the second and third person charged in this case. In February 2013 Detective Holler charged Kayla Colodta Willis of Frederick with similar charges related to this case (see previous release below).

Frederick Police Make Arrest In Burglary Case



On July 16, 2012 the Frederick Police Department responded to a residential burglary that has just occurred in the 1600 block of Shookstown Road Frederick MD. A homeowner was inside of the residence when the suspect broke a rear window attempting to enter the residence. The suspect in this case fled the scene prior to Officers arrival. The scene was processed and the case was transferred to the Criminal Investigation Division. Det. Lege was assigned as the lead Detective. Through the course of the investigation Det. Lege was able to identify the suspect as, Charles James Williams DOB 03/05/1952.

Det. Lege obtained a District Court Warrant for Williams in reference to the attempted burglary of this residence. On 03/12/2013 Officer Cosgray with the Frederick Police Department located and arrested Williams for the outstanding arrest warrant.

Investigation by Frederick Police leads to 3 subjects charged with Burglary, Theft and other charges

An initial call for a stolen vehicle on 01/14/13 leads to an investigation where charges ranging from vehicle theft and burglary, to credit card fraud and rogue and vagabond, are placed on 3 suspects. One of the suspects is a juvenile male, and the other 2 are adult males. OFC Gregory Loftis of the Frederick Police Department's Street Crimes Unit filed the paperwork on 03/07/13. He was assisted in the investigation by Patrol officers, as well as members of the Crime Analysis Team.

The initial incident occurred on 01/14/13 in the 3000 block of Cloister Way, when the victim found that his 2000 Ford Expedition along with several other items inside his house were missing. Officers first responding discovered that the suspects had broken into another vehicle outside, and stole keys that were for the residence and the stolen Expedition. Credit cards, an Ipad and other personal items were taken from the vehicles and the residence. Tracking of the stolen cards enabled OFC Loftis to identify the suspects through store surveillance. Interviews with the suspects led to confessions about their involvement in the crime spree. This investigation could not have been completed without diligence and a substantial amount of time and hard work. The two adults were served with arrest warrants early in the evening of 03/12/13.

Frederick Police Department Investigating Bank Robbery at Sun Trust Bank, 2013015651

On today's date, 03-13-13, at approximately 1523 hours, Frederick Police Department officers respond to a Bank Robbery at Sun Trust Bank located on Rosemont Ave. Upon arriving in the area, a Frederick Police officer observed a vehicle matching the description of a vehicle believed to be involved in the Robbery. The officer located the vehicle in the area of W. 7th St. and RT. 15. The Officer attempted to initiate a stop on the vehicle, however, the vehicle failed to stop and fled. The vehicle led Frederick Police officers on a pursuit onto Rt 15 southbound, at which time the pursuit was joined by officers with the Frederick County Sheriff's Office and MD State Police. The MD State helicopter also joined and assisted. After the pursuit traveled onto County surface roads and back into the City, pursuing officers had to slow their pursuit due to congested roads and the danger posed to motorists and pedestrians. The suspect vehicle was lost, but with the assistance of the MD State helicopter, the vehicle was quickly located abandoned to the rear of a business in the 100 block of S. Market St.

The investigation is currently still on-going and the suspect of the Bank Robbery is still at large. The Frederick Police Department's Criminal Investigations Division is currently working the investigation and following active leads. The suspect vehicle recovered was a white Honda Accord with Pennsylvania Tags. The suspect in the Robbery was described as a white male, medium height and weight, dark short hair. A second person of interest was a passenger in the vehicle described at this point only as a black male. No injuries was reported as a result of the Robbery or the pursuit. No other information is being released at this point.

Frederick Man Arrested for Sex Offense (CID)



On 06/14/2012 Detective D. Ames of the Frederick Police Department's Criminal Investigation Division received a report of a sex offense which had occurred several years prior.

The juvenile victim in this case reported that in 2010 she was an eighth grade student and was solicited by a person she previously knew to engage in a sexual relationship. The suspect was 27 years old at the time. Det. Ames identified the suspect to be Ivan Alexander Angulo DOB 05/01/1982.

The investigation by Det. Ames revealed that Angulo drove from Frederick MD to Hagerstown MD to pick the juvenile up and transport her back to his residence in Frederick MD. Once at the residence Angulo and the juvenile victim engaged in sexual acts including sexual intercourse. Angulo and the juvenile victim maintained this sexual relationship for approximately one year. On 03/08/2013 the case was presented to the Frederick County Grand Jury. The grand jury indicted Angulo charging him with three counts of third degree sex offense.

On 03/14/2013 Det. Ames located Angulo at his residence and arrested him based on this indictment. At the time of arrest Angulo also had an outstanding arrest warrant through Washington County MD which was also served on him.

Frederick Police Theft and Drug Arrests
